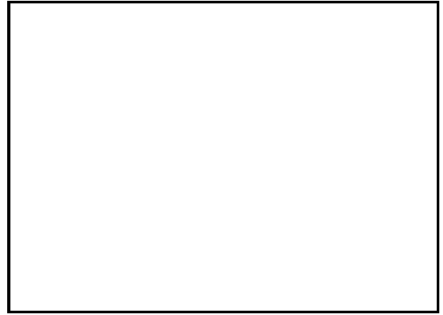
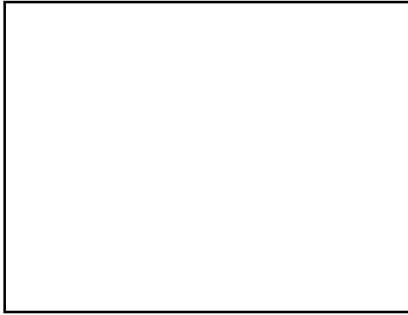
Behaviour Policy

We try to **understand why** children behave in the way they do. At times, children may have worries or muddles which result in them behaving in ways which cause concern. We try to enable children to better understand themselves and to then develop strategies which will help them to make positive choices regarding their behaviour.



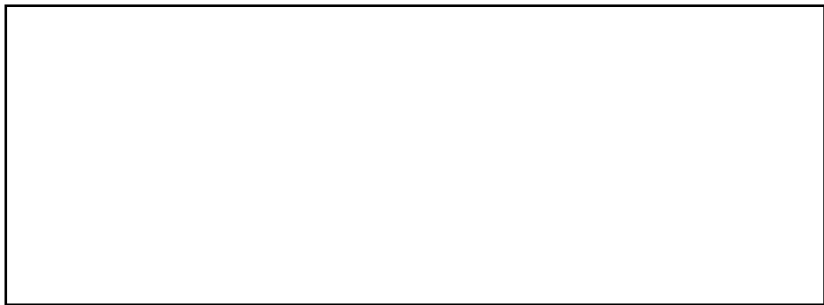
The children's responsibilities are:

- To follow the school rules
 - To communicate and listen to all others
 - To treat others the way they would like to be treated
 - To be honest and fair
 - To show respect for their environment
 - To consider the feelings and needs of others
 - To work hard and treat school as a place of learning
 - To play and work safely
 - To accept responsibility for their own actions
 - To respect the different cultures within school
 - To ask if they don't understand
- and will become greater the older they become



The staff responsibilities are:


- To be a good role model
- To be aware of and follow the school's behaviour policy
- To be here!
- To listen to all others
- To be honest and fair
- To be clear about our expectations and make them explicit
- To mediate and problem solve



- To foster a safe environment
- To respect the different cultures within school
- To consider children's feelings/needs
- To foster the understanding that different people have different needs
- To have awareness of issues which may affect a child's behaviour
- To provide a broad, challenging curriculum to inspire all children
- To praise reward and encourage
- To share children's achievements with home
- To communicate any concerns/worries about children with parents/carers

Parents/Carers responsibilities are:

- To be aware of and support the school's policy on behaviour
- To encourage your children to have a positive attitude towards school and learning
- To be positive and proud of your child's achievements
- To make sure your children arrive, and are collected, on time ~ and travel safely



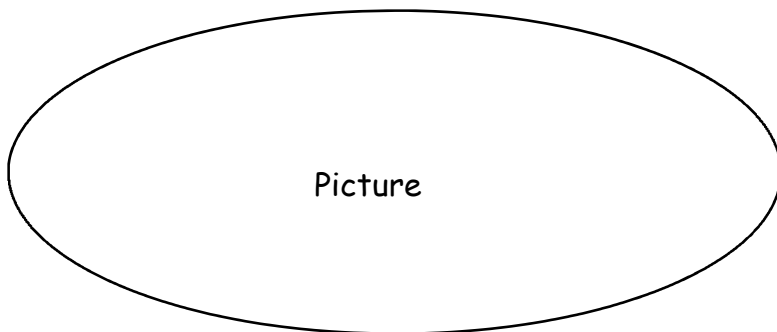
Remember:
Under 16's are not allowed to bring siblings to school without consent.

- To communicate with the adults involved in your child's care, sharing relevant information
- To encourage your children to respect other people and not to discriminate against them because they are different
- To encourage your children to sort out difficulties without hitting, fighting, swearing, spitting, biting or punching, at home and at school

All members of the school community - children, staff and parents - have responsibilities to ensure we make our school a safe and happy learning environment.

What we do if a problem arises:

- Encourage children to take **responsibility** for their own behaviour and to recognise the **consequences** of their behaviour
- Encourage children to recognise **choices** they can make and strategies they can use



These are the steps we would take:

- Ask them to stop misbehaving
- Discuss each incident with the children involved
- Ask children to reflect on their behaviour and to consider why it is inappropriate
- Where possible, (with adult guidance where necessary) we encourage children to try to resolve disagreements themselves
