



Historical, Geographical and Social Understanding

- Compare locations within and outside of the UK using a variety of geographical resources and consider the varied experiences of people living in different places
- Know when, how and why faith communities celebrate Diwali, Eid, Hanukkah and Christmas
- Think about celebrations from a secular perspective also

Outcomes

An increased knowledge and understanding of the spiritual lives and practices of children in their class and communities in the wider world.



Mathematical Understanding

- Use their understanding of place value to know the relative size of numbers
- Multiply numbers by 10, 100 and 100
- Revisit a conceptual understanding of multiplication and division
- Secure an efficient written strategy for multiplication and division
- Explore 3D shapes, their properties and nets
- Use understanding of shape to design, make and evaluate a Christmas decoration.
- Work collaboratively to investigate questions and solve problems



Outcomes:

Confident understanding of the worth of digits

Ability to multiply numbers by 10 and 100

Understand what multiplication and division means, have a quick way of doing this on paper and can check their own work for accuracy.

Children can name and describe 3D shapes

Deeper understanding of number through problem solving.

Understanding English, Communication, and Languages

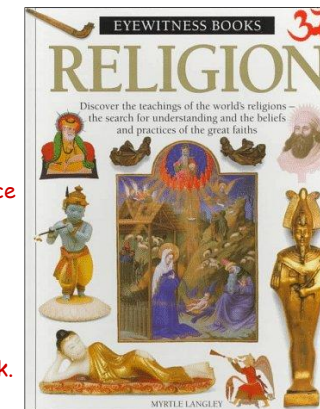
- Read a variety of information text
- Learn to recognise the features of a report
- Organise information, linking ideas
- Learn sentence structures typical of information writing
- Draft, evaluate and edit information writing
- Use Microsoft Publisher to present their work
- Continue to build confidence and vocabulary in French!

Outcomes:

Children set goals for themselves and know how to improve their work

Children will know the difference between fiction and non-fiction writing and use this to communicate information effectively.

Children have an understanding of how different languages work.



Understanding Physical Development, Health and Wellbeing

- Develop ball control skills, team work and spatial awareness through playing hockey
- Explore the possibilities for communicating a narrative through dance
- Develop their understanding of how their relationships and bodies change as they grow older

Outcomes:

Increased fitness, confidence and co-ordination.

Children will experience the pleasure of expressing themselves to music as they produce a dance that tells the Hindu story of Rama and Sita. Children will have a greater understanding of the social, emotional and physical changes that take place during puberty.
