Communication, Language & Literacy Development

- Reading different Fairy Tales
- Retelling Fairy Tales in role play areas

Adult-led outcomes:

- ✓ To retell the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff using Talk for Writing
- ✓ To listen to different Fairy Tales

Child-initiated outcomes:

- ✓ To engage in role play

Physical Development

- Practising scissor control and co-ordination
- Playing games such as 'What's the time Mr. Wolf' and 'piggy in the middle'

Adult-led outcomes:

- ✓ To make masks and story props
- ✓ To use the space outside safely

Knowledge & Understanding of the World

- Exploring and using different materials
- Using different materials to recreate scenes / objects from Fairy Tales

Adult-led outcomes:

- ✓ Using senses to explore materials used in Fairy Tales such as straw and sticks

Child-initiated outcomes:

- ✓ To construct with a purpose in mind

Problem Solving, Reasoning & Numeracy

- Developing an understanding of numbers and counting

Adult-led outcomes:

- ✓ To recognise numerals of personal significance
- ✓ To recognise groups of objects

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- Weekly circle-time sessions focusing on what we like and how we feel
- Talking about stranger danger

Adult-led outcome:

- ✓ To begin to speak in a larger group



Creative Development

- Weekly music sessions
- Pretend play in the castle, Bears house, Witches house, Troll Bridge and shop

Adult-led outcomes:

- ✓ Listening to and making music

Child-initiated outcomes:

- ✓ To engage in role play

How you can help at home

- ✓ Encourage your child to talk about and retell known Fairy Tales

- ✓ Use recycled materials to build models with your child (the three little pigs houses)
- ✓ Read your book every night and record in reading diary at least twice per week for a superstamper
- ✓ Bring in school fund once per week
